FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. What is the KPLI?

A. The Kentucky Physicians Leadership Institute, an initiative of the Kentucky Foundation for Medical Care and the Kentucky Medical Association, is designed to enhance the leadership skills of physicians who can fill emerging leadership roles and influence health care policy in the ever-evolving world of medicine. The KPLI is offered as part of our leadership initiatives—which include the KMA Community Connector Leadership Program, the KMA Medical Student Outreach and Leadership Program, and the Kentucky Physicians Leadership Academy, held each year during the KMA Annual Meeting.

Q. When will the sessions be held?

A. Sessions will be held on four weekends during the summer: July 17-18, July 31-August 1, August 14-15 and August 28-30. Each session will begin midday Friday featuring focused and interactive sessions on each leadership topic. Friday evening will feature a reception and dinner which will include a Fireside Chat with a local expert. Sessions continue on Saturday morning, concluding by noon, with the exception of Leadership in Action, which is a part of the 2020 KMA Annual Meeting.

Q. Where will the sessions be held?

A. Sessions will be held in Louisville and in Frankfort.

Q. Who is eligible to apply?

A. Members in good standing of the Kentucky Medical Association and its component societies as of April 1, 2020, are eligible to apply.

Q. Who are the faculty?

A. Butler University will provide faculty for Personal and Business and KMA will provide faculty for Leadership in Advocacy and Leadership in Action. In addition, the first three sessions will include a Q&A session with an expert in each focus area and will be announced at a later date.

Q. What makes this program different than other leadership programs?

A. The KPLI includes a section on advocacy, which many programs do not. Physicians can play a key role as health care continues to evolve and a knowledge of how to work with government stakeholders will be important.

Q. What will be expected/required of participants?

A. The KPLI will strive to provide the most comprehensive leadership information for physicians in Kentucky. For that reason, the program will have several expectations of participants.

- Participants will be required to attend and participate in all four modules.
- Participants will be required to complete a confidentiality agreement certifying that they will not reveal any proprietary information that may be shared during the course.
- Participants will be asked to complete a release allowing their photo, quotes and video to be used by and shared by KMA for promotional purposes and media inquiries.
- Participants will be asked to actively engage in group discussions and classwork. Participants will also be expected to complete pre-conference background work as well as complete take home work throughout the program.
- Participants will be asked to share a biography and/or CV for promotional and communication purposes.
- Participants will be asked to stay at the hotel provided during the specific dates of the program, including those who live in the community where the session is being held.

Q. What is the cost of participation?

A. Tuition for the KPLI is very competitive with that of other leadership programs for physicians. The total cost of the program is \$2,995.

Q. What is included in the tuition?

A. The tuition includes hotel accommodations, reception and dinner for Friday evening of each session; breakfast and lunch for the Saturday of each session; all meeting materials; and certificate upon completion provided by Butler University. In addition, KMA will recognize your participation and completion of the program through association publications as well as local and statewide media outlets.

Q. Can I earn CME Credit?

A. Yes. Learners will earn Category 1 CME credit for each session.

Q. What is the deadline to apply for the program?

A. Applications will be accepted through March 30, 2020. KMA/KFMC will notify those accepted into the program by mail.
